

Ichneumonoidea (Hymenoptera) from Los Monegros

Studies on the Ichneumonoidea have only just begun, and inevitably the problems of identifying this component of the fauna will be mean that results will remain very far from complete for the foreseeable future. But the early indications are that a high degree of endemism will be found, and several surprises have been noted - for example the braconid genus *Yelicones* new to the Palaearctic Region (Shaw, 1998); and the Central Asian ichneumonid genus *Eremura* (Notton & Shaw, 1998). Undescribed species will probably turn out to be numerous.
