## Conops silaceus Wiedemann in Meigen, 1824 (Diptera, Conopidae): First record from Portugal

According to the checklist of Carles-Tolrá & Báez (2002), *Conops silaceus* Wiedmann, 1824 (in Meigen, 1824) has not previously been recorded from Portugal although it is known from Spain. A single male of this species was swept from the flowers of a mint species (*Mentha cf. spicata*) growing in woodland with *Vinca major*, *Rubus ulmifolius*, *Phytolacca americana*, *Picris sp.* and *Pinus pinaster* at Póvoa Dão, near Silgueiros in the Viseu district of northern Portugal (40° 33' 3.78" N; 7° 56' 36.85" W) by JMA on 21st August 2008. The specimen was subsequently identified by DKC from photographs via the *Diptera Info* website (http://www.diptera.info). *Conops silaceus* Wiedmann in Meigen, 1824 is a local but widely distributed species of southern and eastern Europe, with records currently known from Crete, Croatia, France, Hungary, Italy and Romania, as well as from Spain (Pape & Clements, 2005).

There are also records from the former Soviet Union (Chvála & Smith 1988). It is one of only two *Conops* Linnaeus, 1758 in Europe in which the scutellum is completely yellow, the other species being the commoner and more generally distributed *Conops scutellatus* Meigen, 1824. This latter species is, however, more

delicate and has a predominantly black body colour (mainly yellow in the larger and more robust *silaceus*), whilst the yellow frons has a narrow vertical black stripe in contrast to the broad, black horizontal band in the upper frons of *C. silaceus*. The larval habits are unknown, but the species is assumed to be an endoparasitoid of aculeate Hymenoptera.
